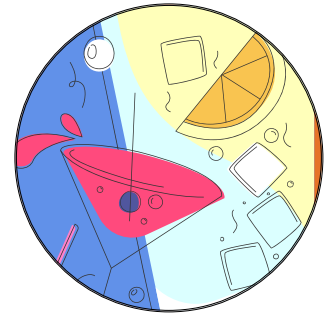

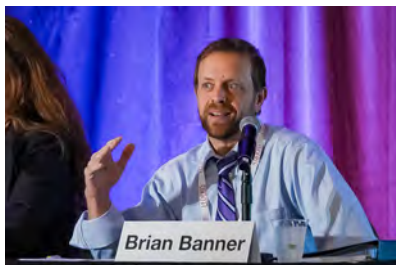

Unchaining the GUI: Navigating the USPTO's New Frontier for Digital and Immersive Design Patents

On March 13, 2026, the USPTO issued game-changing supplemental guidance that fundamentally alters the landscape for protecting user experience and user interface (UX/UI) design. By removing the archaic requirement to visually depict a physical display screen in design drawings, the Office has streamlined the path to protection for traditional software interfaces while explicitly opening the doors to emerging spatial computing formats. This session will analyze the immediate operational impacts of this new guidance. We will explore how to leverage the relaxed drawing standards for traditional graphical user interfaces (GUIs), the newfound eligibility framework for projections, holograms, and AR/VR environments, and how these broader patent pathways intersect with a tightening enforcement environment at the Federal Circuit. Additionally, we will discuss various ambiguities in the language, our interpretation, and how the USPTO could amend or adjust the guidance to give further clarification. Attendees will gain practical strategies for updating their design patent drafting templates and future-proofing their digital product portfolios.

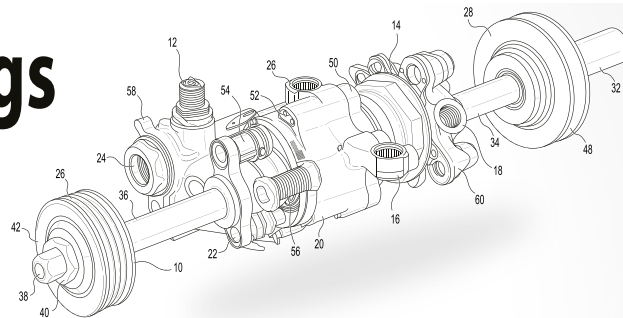

ETHICS

This panel will explore the circumstances that may require or support an attorney's withdrawal from an attorney-client relationship in accordance with Rule 11.116, and the potential difficulties that may arise when the client does not want the lawyer to withdraw. The panel will also discuss the lawyer's confidentiality obligations, duty to cooperate with new counsel, conflicts (particularly in a joint client context, when withdrawal is required only for one of the clients), and related issues.

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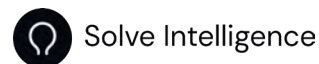
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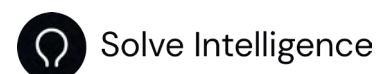

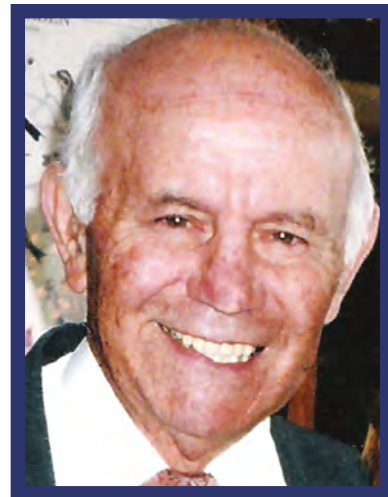
