The USPTO formally rescinded the February 2024 Biden-era guidance that allowed AI systems to perform acts that, if performed by a human, could constitute inventorship, consistent with decisions such as *Thaler v. Vidal*. The February 2024 guidance provided that “a natural person must have significantly contributed to each claim in a patent application or patent,” requiring careful scrutiny of prompts presented to the AI system to determine whether the natural person made significant contributions.

The risks of infringement from AI-generated content mimicking existing content, images, and brands (logos, names, slogans), leading to consumer confusion, dilution, and brand damage, while also challenging how to protect AI-created original content, with companies needing to actively police AI use and ensure AI training data avoids IP infringement to safeguard their brands. Key problems include AI generating “look-alike” content, AI chat-bots hallucinating misleading brand affiliations, and difficulty attributing liability when infringement occurs, pushing for new legal guidelines.

“Due Care” requirements, such as for reinstating applications/patents where a maintenance fee is not paid. It would be good to have a comparative panel to discuss requirements and pitfalls in various jurisdictions (US, CA, EPO, JP, CN) where reinstatement of an inadvertently abandoned case is sought. In Canada, for example, a recent decision by our Federal Court of Appeal overturned a lower court’s decision that was somewhat helpful to applicants/patentees. As it now stands, the action of all parties involved in maintenance fee process (CA agent, foreign associate, annuity service, and rights holder) are scrutinized.

As companies increasingly build value around data sets, machine-learning models, and algorithm-driven products, IP transactions are rapidly evolving. Traditional frameworks for trade secrets, copyright, and patent licensing now intersect with privacy law, cyber security obligations, and emerging AI regulations. This panel will examine how outside and in-house counsel can structure agreements where training data, models, and derived outputs each function as distinct assets, raising novel questions about ownership, confidentiality, cross-border transfers, indemnification, and auditability. Speakers will provide practical guidance for negotiating AI-heavy collaborations, managing risk in data-centric M&A and joint development agreements, and aligning trade secret protection with privacy and regulatory compliance in the U.S., EU, and key Asian jurisdictions.

Examiner interviews remain one of the most effective tools in patent prosecution—but how well do we really understand this practice? The USPTO recently introduced USPTO AIR, a web-based platform that allows applicants to request and conduct interviews for their pending applications. Whether you’re new to practice or a seasoned practitioner, interviewing examiners is a skill that needs continual refinement. In this session, we hope to bring in USPTO Examiners to share their insights and perspectives.

The presentation will include a review of the DMCA's conduct standards and downside risks for failure to meet those standards, including the Cox issued decisions on the knowledge standards for direct, contributory, and vicarious infringement, and the *Athos Overseas Ltd. Corp. v. YouTube Inc.* et al., decision in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit.

This panel will discuss why IP practitioners should become familiar with regulatory exclusivities and how this knowledge brings value to stakeholders focused on product and business development in the pharmaceutical, biologic, and medical device spaces. Regulatory and patent exclusivity drive significant value during the product development life cycle and can be critical factors in patent prosecution strategy and in the evaluation of merger and acquisition, licensing opportunities and/or litigation. In the commercialization of medical products, regulatory strategy is often inextricably intertwined with other business and legal topics, such as intellectual property protection and competitive intelligence. This panel will discuss, from both a regulatory and IP perspective, how alignment of strategy can help identify opportunities to leverage exclusivity windows which may be driven by both patent protection, and regulatory submissions. It is important for both private and in-house counsel practitioners (particularly those practicing in patent prosecution, patent litigation, and IP transactions) to understand both the regulatory and patent regimes that provide exclusivity protection for pharmaceutical, biologic, and medical device products to provide more value to clients engaged in product and/or business development in this space.

This panel examines the rapid evolution of the "failure-to-function" doctrine in trademark prosecution and litigation, focusing on how recent decisions are reshaping what can (and cannot) serve as a trademark. Using the Federal Circuit's 2025 decision in *In re Brunetti* and the district court rulings in *Penn State v. Vintage Brand* as anchors, the program would walk through recent precedents involving slogans, social messages, and Internet memes (including *In re Lizzo LLC* and other commonplace-phrase cases), as well as litigated disputes where defendants have asserted failure-to-function as a defense to infringement cases (including *Vintage Brand* as well as other recent decisions like *Top Brand v. Cozy Comfort*). The session would emphasize practical takeaways for brand owners and in-house counsel: how examining attorneys are using marketplace evidence to support refusals; how failure-to-function interacts with related doctrines like ornamentation and genericness; and what prosecution, clearance, and enforcement strategies can mitigate risk and build a record to either avoid or overcome these refusals in a post-*Brunetti* landscape.



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
